THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM SCTC's Adult Education Program

Southern Crescent Dr. Murray Williams, Technical College Vice President for Adult Education, is looking for partnerships and assistance in providing for adult education in Spalding County and in the eight counties served by SCTC. Williams noted that 21% of those living in Spalding County do not have high school She added, "14,000 people in diplomas. Spalding will not qualify for the 300 new jobs that are being created by Rinnai, a new manufacturing business moving here." She asserted that SCTC's investment in adult education is an investment in Spalding County. A mainstay in their efforts is to prepare adults for the Graduate Equivalency Degree (GED) testing. This program is offered on the main campus in Griffin, but SCTC is extending to other locations, including neighborhoods and communities, to reach even more people. Williams is asking for others to partner with SCTC to expand offerings, hire instructors, and provide for administration. "It all costs money," she said. She asked for assistance in identifying sources for possible grants and also for donations to support scholarships for the "The cost of taking the GED is students \$160.00 which can be a burden to the student," she added. Williams plans to open tutoring programs for students in Spalding, Henry, Upson, and Fayette counties. These will need tutors, space, and equipment. Williams also asked that employers consider hiring those enrolled in the GED program and provide them an interval of time to successfully complete the GED. Williams, who was introduced by Rotarian Dr. Alvetta Thomas, SCTC President, is new to her position. She joined SCTC in September coming from Atlanta Technical College.
