THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Club Assembly

President Tom Gardner kicked off Club Assembly by explaining that our Club has a Board of eight Directors who oversee 39 committees. He added that the Club was where he projected we should be at this time of his term as President to which he credited the Directors. He asked for reports or presentations from three of the Board. Art Hammond, Club Treasurer, led off by asking for a show

of hands from those who liked numbers and budgets. Approximately 5% raised their hands. Art said that he always thought about 95% of people were bored with financial reports. So, he referred everyone to the budget that is placed in the back of the Club Handbook each year. But, he explained we have two budgets - an operating budget and a project budget. The annual operating budget comes from membership dues and is approximately \$140,000 with \$15K to district and international dues, \$24K to our project fund, \$10K to District Conference, \$12.5K to President-Elect attendance of RI Convention, and \$50K to our weekly meals. The project budget for this year is \$41,000 and comes from the Sombrero Dash fundraiser (\$8K), our operating budget (\$24K), and interest and dividends from investments (\$3K). The project budget funds our GRSP student (\$17K) and our community service projects. Art further explained the Club's investment portfolio of \$325,000 was in CD's until recently when they were cashed and invested in the stock market with three firms operated by members of our Club. John White, Director for Club Administration, discussed the District Conference which is scheduled to be held in San Destin April 26 - 29. John reported that 16 of 20 rooms the Club had reserved at the Embassy Suites have already been claimed by members planning to attend. John explained that participating in District Conference is more Rotary fellowship than attending meetings. John is planning for our Club to host a low country boil, a hospitality room, and other socials. He said that the Conference this year will be 20% meetings and 80% fellowship. Awards will even be presented later in the Rotary year. As in past years, the Club will pay one night's room for members, and members who have joined within the past year will have two nights paid by the Club. Charles Woodroof, Director for Membership, then stepped up to provide som e Holiday-Spirited Sunshine. Brett Bell, a member of the Sunshine Committee, also added some timely barbs.
